Move (Motivated Volunteer Empowerment)

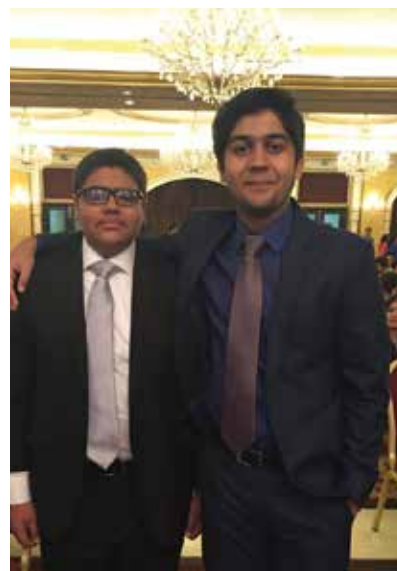

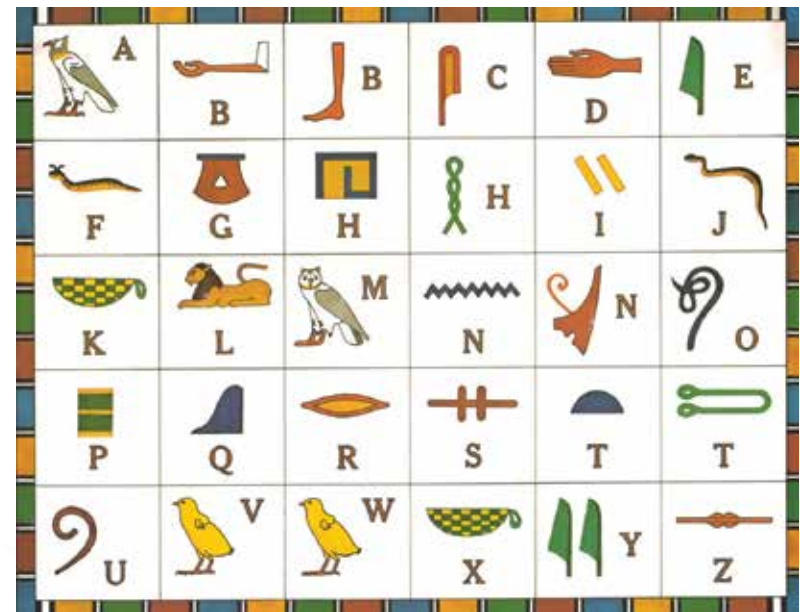
Class III is so much fun! We get to study about so many wonderful things like Energy, Land and Climate and Ancient Civilizations.
